# Greetings from Rev. Lisa Graves

October 2024, This past Sunday at our tremendous celebration of confirmation and our bishop's visitation, we were given a compliment that may sound surprising. We were told that thanks to our efforts to grow in size and mission, we are no longer considered a small church. We have been declared "average"! It is an incredible milestone to be in the average size category for Episcopal churches and it shows that we have worked together and thrived in the process because moving from one category to another is a good, but sometimes, difficult thing for congregations to do.

### In an ECVF article:

- The smallest churches are considered **Family size**. This is most Episcopal churches these days. They are a single cell group, and they are governed or run by a few key families or even one family. This doesn't mean there are not are not more families, it just means that a few folks seem to be running most things and that everyone knows everything that is going on. The priest is seen as a chaplain of sorts, shepherding folks in their most human moments of birth, death, celebration and loss. When fights occur, they are family feuds and grudges are held for a long, long time.
- The next church size up is considered **Pastoral size.** This is where we are now. It is priest centered in that the priest knows most everything that is going on and the governance still includes those key families but new groups are forming. This is when not every person knows everything that is happening any longer. The pastor is at center of program and new member incorporation. Fights are over the pastor (and his/her attention or direction and changes that are made.)
- **Transitional size** occurs when you are growing from a Pastoral sized church to a program church. In this model every person and program is stretched thin. The key family ('s) are still on Vestry,

But many new groups, and some outside influence and subgroups form. The priest is stretched - at cusp of needing additional staff, but resources may not be there to fund this. Any fights are over inclusion/information/communication/attention of clergy.

Finally we have the **Program size church**. This is a corporate style church with Multicell and group-centered governance. The committees have power; Vestry moves to oversight/direction; they are more relational and less task-focused. The pastor is administrator/delegator. Fights are over resources and priorities.

So we are now a pastoral sized church. A church that is large enough to be doing big things, but small enough to still care and know one another. The bishop was so enthusiastic about us, our church, our members, our programs and our energy.

And that is a compliment to every one of you. The church is after all, not the building or the priest but the people. We are blessed with the best people around and I give thanks to God for all of you!
